Remote learning reminder for year nine parents

If your child is absent from school, but well enough to complete school work, it is essential they complete the remote learning set by their teachers so that they do not fall behind. Remote learning is available daily for all students who are absent and mirrors the key learning concepts that would have been covered in school on each given day.

Remote learning can be found by logging into the Google classroom belonging to each class your child would have had in school and following the 'remote learning' instructions for that classroom. Each subject teacher will display weekly work on their Google Classroom homepage. Here you will find an overview of lessons to be completed each day that your child is self-isolating. The school will provide learning across the curriculum to reflect your child's school timetable and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would have spent in school.

Frequently asked questions:

What information might I find useful in the event of my child self-isolating or school closure?

-  A copy of your child's timetable (this should be in their planner. If they have lost it and they are absent from school please contact our main reception who can email you a copy).
-  Guardian access to your child's Google classrooms.
-  A copy of your child's Google classroom log-in details and classroom codes (these will be written in your child's planner).

What do I do if my child has lost their Google classroom codes?

-  Please contact Mr Clappison at jclappison@fs.ebor.academy. You will need to provide: your child's full name, their teachers' names and their class names. We will then email you the correct codes for the classroom.

How do students who have registered with the school as having no digital capacity (e.g. chrome book/laptop/computer and/or access to the internet?) access learning?

-  You need to contact our main reception to organise a pre-booked time to collect your child's learning for the week ahead in paper format.
-  Completed work should be handed in at the end of the two week self-isolation period to reception or directly to class teachers.

What do I do if my child is not able to access the learning digitally but I have not yet registered this with the school?

-  You need to contact our main reception and complete the information request sent out previously as soon as possible. We are trying to contact all parents who have not yet returned their forms to ensure all our students have access to the learning.

What feedback will my child receive?

Students should send all completed work to their class teacher via Google classroom. The frequency of feedback for students will vary according to the number of curriculum hours allocated to a specific subject. As a minimum, however, students should expect feedback from their teacher once every two weeks of absence from school. As is standard at Ebor Academy Filey, students will continue to be expected to respond to their feedback making the suggested improvements where applicable.
